

Recent Event Recap: *Electrification of Air Transportation* May 21, 2021

On Wednesday, May 12th, Keizai Silicon Valley held its first regular forum of this year on the topic of the Electrification of Air Transportation. Keizai's Phil Keys moderated a panel of speakers from



consulting firm Aerial Innovation, ANA Strategic Research Institute, and JAXA. Fred Borda of Aerial Innovation led off the evening with an overview of how electrification is likely to enter air transport. Small rotary wing and propeller aircraft will be first, with large aircraft not being electrified until the 2040's or later. Yasutada Tanabe continued the evening by explaining some of the research that JAXA is doing. Tanabe-san started out with unmanned helicopters. He is also looking into noise analysis and certain hybrid designs. Shigeru Takano of ANA rounded out the

panel mentioning that companies like Uber might get involved in electrified Urban Aerial Mobility (UAM). One can imagine short distance shuttles flying over congested city traffic. Although there are many challenges to overcome, electrified air transportation is gaining increased attention.

More Productive From Home?


